**Christmas Tree Fly** 

Dave refers to this picture as his forest. Last time we tied this I said it wouldn't catch a fish but he said he put a hook on one and caught a fish. I know it will be a Christmas tree ornament at my house. It also makes a unique gift. Come tie one with us at the last fly tying session of the year, you will enjoy it.

#### Material List:

Thread; Black Green or Brown Spinning hair or Deer Hair; Color Green or whatever color you would like for your tree; 1" Dowel with hole in center Stain Pen for Base; Craft Store Star 15-20 pearlized push pins with stems cut off %" brown felt strip for wrapping tree stump Paper clip or other 14 gauge wire with a loop. Crazy Glue

Everything will be provided except for the thread.

There won't be fly tying on December 23 because it is so close to Christmas. Have a merry Christmas and happy New Year. Stay safe this holiday season.

All are welcome! Fly tying equipment is available for new tyers. Come and discover the joy of catching fish on a fly you tied or, better yet, one of your own design. Join us for a two-hour session on Dec. 9. Normally, the sessions are the  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  Thursdays at 7 p.m.


#### **Banquet and Auction Recap**

# **Dirty Santa Gift Exchange**

Join the fun! Bring a wrapped gift of modest value (\$20 or less), either serious or gag gift, and be prepared to "steal" a more "desirable" gift as the game progresses. Gifts should be suitable for a mixed audience.


The more times a gift is stolen the greater the enjoyment, but remember, after a gift has been stolen 3 times, it's frozen and can no longer be stolen. So there is strategy involved. How to steal the gift you really want on that 3<sup>rd</sup> and final time?

Each game participant will receive a free ticket for the "Dirty Santa" Gift drawing. So come and join us as we celebrate Christmas in a uniquely fly fishing way.



- Place wrapped gifts in the middle of the circle.
- Each guest draws a number.
- #1 chooses a gift, unwraps it, shows it off, and puts it on display. Gifts must stay in view at all times and remain in their original packaging.
- #2 chooses to either steal #1's gift or picks a new one.
- #3 chooses to steal #1 or #2's gift or selects a new gift.
- If #3 steals #1's gift, #1 can either steal #2's gift or choose an unopened gift.
- A gift can not be stolen back during the same turn.
   Example: If #3 steals #2's gift, #2 can not steal the gift back until the next turn.
- A gift can be stolen up to three times before it is frozen. The gift is frozen with the fourth owner.
- If #1 has the same gift they started with, and no one has stolen from them, they get to trade with any unfrozen gift.
- This is where the game ends! We hope it was filled with lots of laughter!





## **Trout Stocked at Madison County Public Fishing Lake**

Trout fishing season at Madison County Public Fishing Lake (PFL) will begin on Friday, November 26, 2021. The Division of Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries plans to stock over 3,000 pounds of rainbow trout in Madison County PFL during the trout season with trout ranging in size from one to two pounds. A \$5.00 Daily Trout Permit in addition to a valid freshwater fishing license is required to fish for trout. Trout anglers may also fish for bass, bluegill, catfish, and crappie. The daily creel limit is 4 trout per angler. Check their website for directions and hours of operation, which are limited, so check before you go.



#### **Trout in Gadsden**

Trout season began October 15<sup>th</sup> on Black Creek, Noccalula Falls near Gadsden, AL. Check the link for more details.

A separate permit is required for \$10 per day or \$30 for the season. It is a delayed harvest stream, catch and release from October  $15^{th}$  – April  $30^{th}$ , and a five fish limit from May  $1^{st}$  – June  $30^{th}$ . Fly rods only, barbless hooks, artificial lures only.



#### **Fly Line Recycling**

Flyvines is a Montana company that "upcycles" used fly line into bracelets, lanyards, dog collars, sunglass straps and other useful items that give used fly line a second life. The picture shows used fly line collected by TVFF in 2019 that didn't end up in a landfill. The pandemic kept us from doing that in 2020 but we'd like to participate again this year. If you respool your fly reels with new line then please coil it up and bring it to us. TVFF will pack it in a box and send it to Flyvines. It is a small thing you can do to be kind to the environment and support our conservation efforts.



#### **Casting for Recovery Fly Boxes**



When you have your set or multiple sets of 14 flies ready for collection, bring them to any club activity or contact Casting for Recovery volunteer Debbie Hill. TVFF will provide the boxes for your donated flies. This fall we will be filling the fly boxes that will be donated to the Alabama Casting for Recovery retreat.
