# **Brian Carrico**



I am originally from Northern Virginia. Was blessed to learn to fish wading the trout streams of western Virginia with my Pop. Received a B.S. degree in Wildlife and Fisheries Science and a M.S. degree in Environmental Toxicology from the University of Tennessee. At UT, I was able to study under Dr. David Etnier who taught me to appreciate non game species, and truly enhanced my appreciation of stream ecology. I was privileged to work at both Oak Ridge National Lab and at Tennessee Valley Authority as an aquatic ecologist, where I was able to travel all over the Tennessee Valley and see the many beautiful streams and rivers in this region.

During the worst of the covid epidemic, as I spent more and more time isolated at home, I began to research all the black bass species, and came up with a goal to catch all of the recently described and proposed species of Micropterus genus. To date, I have been able to catch 10 of the 15 species of bass. Although, depending upon the source, there may actually be a total of 17 to 19 species/sub-species of bass. My talk will focus on describing the lesser known bass species, where they can be found, and the fun I have had in my quest to catch all of them.

This hopper pattern comes from Walter Wiese, a guide in Montana. Those western trout patterns have proven successful all around the country. We will tie it in a size 10.

#### **Materials**

**Hook:** Size 10 2x long light wire or standard wire hook **Thread:** White or black 140 denier (or match foam color"

Wing: Elk hair, deer hair or poly post material

**Body:** Dubbing

Legs: Medium rubber legs



Sept 28<sup>th</sup> 7PM Kreb's Popper Jig

Cost: \$3.00

In collaboration with River Road Creations, Gary Krebs came up with a tool to form your own popper from a cylinder. These are cheap and will last! Purchased at Orvis in Huntsville.

Materials (Many color combinations work)

Hook: Gamagatsu B10S

Thread: 6/0 or 140 denier, white

**Body**: Foam Cylinders **Legs:** Silli Legs (8per side)

Tail: Foxtail and hackle, with crystal flash


# Fish of the Month















# More Fish of the Month





# Caney Fork Call to Action

The time is now, and here's what you can do: submit comments to the Corps of Engineers demanding a better plan than the one they've produced as part of the update to the Center Hill Dam Water Control Manual.



The Corps of Engineers (USACE) must either redo and expand their insufficient Environmental Assessment produced as a part of the update to the Center Hill Water Control manual OR move to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement, in a manner and with a level of evaluation commensurate with the scale and scope of the impacts created by Alternatives 4, 17 and 23 to the Caney Fork River, that achieves compliance with the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act of 1958 and the Federal Clean Water Act, and that also complies with USACE own internal policies pertaining to water quality and environment operating procedures.

The Corps has proven under most circumstances and conditions that it is capable of meeting water quality standards and project purposes. HOWEVER, since 2017 the Corps has repeatedly managed Center Hill in a manner that has perpetuated poor dissolved oxygen, problematic temperatures, and problematic river flows — all parameters identified as factors impairing the Caney Fork River placing it on the "Listing of Impaired Waters under Section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act".

# Aldridge Creek Cleanup



# **Johnny Appleseed Day**

**Date When Celebrated :** March 11th and/or September 26th. Why two dates?.....read on

Johnny Appleseed Day honors one of America's great legends. Johnny Appleseed was a real person. John Chapman was among the American settlers who were captivated by the movement west across the continent. As Johnny Appleseed travelled west, he planted apple trees along the way, and sold trees to settlers. With every apple tree that was planted, the legend grew.



A Little About the Legend: John Chapman (aka Johnny Appleseed) was born on September 26, 1774. He was a nurseryman who started out planting trees in western New York and Pennsylvania. During the life of John Chapman, the "West" was places like Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, and Illinois. John Chapman was a deeply religious person He was known to preach during his travels.

According to legend, Johnny Appleseed led a simple life and wanted little. He rarely accepted money and often donated any money he received. It is believed that he died on March 11, 1845, from what was referred to as the "winter plague". The actual date of his death has been disputed.

There is a lot of "legend" in stories written about Johnny Appleseed. By it's definition, over the years, legends grow bigger than life. It also appears that there is some link between Johnny Appleseed and very early Arbor Day celebrations.


