Polish Pheasant Tail Nymph

Cost: \$3.00

Materials

Hook: size 12, 14 or 16 nymph hook

Thread: Red or Black 8/0

Tail: Rooster Saddle feather fibers

Body: Pheasant Tail

Dubbing: Rabbit, Hares mask or other

We tied some neat flies for the month of October. For the first session, Andy King led us in tying the Rosenhopper. A fly invented by Orvis instructor Tom Rosenbauer. For the second session, Debbie Hill led us in tying a spooky glow in the dark crappie bug. She brought a lot of neat materials with her. Take a look.







Fly to Leader Knots

The first fishing knot I learned to tie was a clinch knot, soon followed by the improved clinch. It is still the knot that I tend to tie first but I have been trying to learn a few new ones. The ones below all have some advantage over what you may be using now. Try them out. There are a lot of good resources on the web. I deliberately picked 3 different sources so you can pick a favorite. I didn't use one of their videos but the guys at Salt Strong have a library of knot tying videos and they test the strength of the knots. Knot strength is one measure but don't get hung up on using the absolute strongest knot. You also need to be able to tie a knot easily and repeatably too.

Davy Knot

Use: Tying fly, lure or hook to leader


Named after Davy Wotton, a noted fly tyer, caster and fisherman, this has got to be the simplest knot to tie and it has excellent strength. Click the picture to link to a Tightline video that also has a bonus tip for tying this knot.



Orvis Knot

Use: Tying fly, lure or hook to leader


This one comes from Orvis. It is only a little more complicated than the Davy knot but still offers a small, extremely strong knot. This knot develops almost 100 % knot strength in a compact package. Click the picture to link to an Orvis instructional video.




Non-Slip Loop Knot

Use: Tying fly, lure or hook to leader

Use this knot to give some added life to your fly. Instead of snugging the knot against the eye this knot leaves a loop of line through the eye. This lets the fly swim and move more than when the hook eye is snug to the tippet. This video comes from the folks at Fly Fish Food.





How an Angler Turned Over \$100,000 Fishing for an Unwanted Species this Summer

Wouldn't it be neat to earn some money fly fishing? Well...the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife might have something for you, fishing for and removing an invasive species. According to an article from <u>Fly Lords</u>, one angler earned over \$100k by removing pikeminnow. The entire article authored by Nelson Oxley can be found below. In the 2023 Northern Pikeminnow Sport Reward Program, a top angler netted over \$100k by removing just over ten thousand pikeminnow, while the runner-up earned \$98k for 9,700 fish. This annual conservation bounty initiative, operating in the lower Columbia River and funded by the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA), runs from May 1 to September 30, offering substantial rewards to anglers who help reduce pikeminnow—a species that preys on salmon and steelhead smolt. Critics argue that the program focuses on the wrong issue, diverting attention from the impact of BPA's dams along the Lower Snake River on native fish species.

No matter your perspective, this program is unquestionably one of the most lucrative ways to catch unwanted fish. In 2023, anglers earned \$6 per fish for their first 25 qualifying (9-inch-plus) catches of the season. Between 25 and 200 fish, the rate was \$8 each, and beyond 200, they earned \$10 each. Specially tagged fish could yield anglers rewards ranging from \$200 to \$500.

FFI Kingfisher Classic - Ted Crona


Ted Crona report on the Kingfisher Classic:

In a word, "EXCELLENT" Venue was much better upgrade from the past SEC events that I have attended. Since this was the first one since the "Fly Tier's Weekend" before Covid, I didn't expect much but it was planned well and organized well. The quality of the 31 tiers was well beyond expectations:

- 1. Peggy Brenner, Citrus Springs, Fl., She is a past International FFI tying chairman and a world renown expert in Streamers. I met her at the 50th anniversary International Fly Fishing Fair in Bend, Or., where she conducted a seminar on streamers which was outstanding.
- 2. Jeff Rowley, Amarillo, TX, a tier who ties excellent deer hair flies and is associated with SemperFli; all of the participating tiers got a box of SemperFli threads.
- 3. David Boyer, Mountain Home, AR, SowBug tying chairman and member of the North Arkansas Fly Fishers
- 4. Kieran Frye, Mount Pleasant, PA, an excellent past Idaho master tier.
- 5. John Kiser, Pisgah Forest, NC, another excellent master tier.
- 6. Probably, the last tier that I expected to see was Brian Bouna; he was not listed as a TVFF member, so I am assuming that he has dropped out of the club. He was tying some of his excellent hoppers and in the course of our conversation, he has gone on one of the "Blood Run" adventures in the remote Amazon jungle. Blood Run came out several years ago as a video of some awesome fly fishing deep in the heart of the Amazon river---best video on fly fishing ever produced. Brian had to wait over 2 years to be selected as one of the fly fisherman to go. He had some excellent photos and experiences.

Hopefully next year we can get more attendance from TVFF employees! Sounds like a great time. Thank you for sharing Ted!

Banquet/Auction Location




