He was named assistant chief of the section in 2012 and Chief of Fisheries in 2019, both located in the Montgomery office.

Featured Tyer – Fred Kaufmann

Materials:

- Thread: 6/0 or 140 thread orange
- Hook: #10 Tiemco 8089 wide gap
- Body: Black foam triangle 1/2 inch-width X 1.5 inch-length
- Underbody: 1/4 inch-wide strip of 2mm foam, orange Estaz, sparkle dubbing
- Legs: Orange/black rubber
- Head: Peacock micro chennille
- Wing: Orange poly yarn
- Eyes: Orange 3/16 inch foam cylinder
- Optional: Single Edge Razor Blade

- Hook: #12 Saber 7052 Lt Shrimp & Caddis Pupa hook
- Body: 2-3 mm by 2mm black foam strip
- Underbody: Orange Ice Dub
- Legs: Small black rubber legs
- Wing: White Para Post/Wing
- Hackle: Furnace dry fly hackle

Catch of the Month



Trout Fishing Resumes at Madison County Public Lake

Trout fishing at Madison County Public Fishing Lake was to resume Saturday, Jan. 30. The trout fishing pond is blocked off from the lake, but fishing for other species is available on the lake proper. The lake is open Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. Trout were stocked in December and were to be stocked in January. A total of 3,000 pounds were to be stocked, ranging in size from one to two pounds. The daily trout creel limit is four per angler. A \$5 daily trout permit is required in addition to a valid Alabama fishing license. Freshwater fishing licenses are available at license vendors or at www.outdoorsalabama.com. Zoom Meeting Instructions

You will receive a Zoom meeting invitation in the TVFF reminder email that is sent on Sunday evening before a scheduled fly tying night or club meeting. There are 3 ways to join the meeting. You can copy/paste the link in the invitation into your browser OR go to <https://zoom.us> and click "Join A Meeting" in the upper right of the screen OR if you have installed the Zoom app then you can open the app and enter the meeting number and password from the invitation. If prompted you should click yes to allow Zoom to use the camera and microphone on your computer, then we can see you and hear you in the meeting. You may be placed in a Zoom "waiting room" when you first join. Be patient and you will be admitted to the meeting by a host or cohost. This is another layer of security for our online meetings.

2021 Donovan Lakes Club Trip

Opened to all club members. Trip includes accommodations at Donovan Inn and four days of fishing at one of the best bass destinations in the country. All for \$320, including meals.

Located in Alabama's Black Belt, Donovan offers eight private lakes stocked and managed for bass.. I know of at least six, 8-lb-plus bass and numerous personal-bests that have been caught on past trips.

We will be fishing two-to-a-boat, so two additional boats will be needed. Kayaks are permitted but in pairs so everyone will have a boat to fish from. Never fished for bass, no problem? Experienced members are happy to coach you.

Donovan requires advance payment, so a nonrefundable \$280 deposit is required to secure your reservation.

A standby list will be maintained and replacements will reimburse your deposit if you are unable to attend. All efforts will be made to find a replacement. To date no one has ever lost their deposits.

They're Back: Trillions Of Cicadas Expected To Emerge

The long awaited Brood 10 will emerge this year. Not familiar with Brood 10? It's no wonder, it's not something that happens every day, or every year for that matter, it only happens once every 17 years.

Brood 10 is the largest cicada hatch in the U.S., possibly the world, and it's coming to a lake or stream near you. This year, Tennessee's Elk river and Tims Ford lake will visited by millions of cicadas.

I was a novice fly fisher when I arrived at Tims Ford Dam during the last hatch. Something was different that day. I could hear a loud screeching sound emanating from the nearby trees, and as I approached the water, I could see the telltale dimples of fish rising all up and down the river. I soon discovered that the cicada hatch was on!

I had to get some cicada flies ASAP. Being new to fly tying and not knowing where to get supplies, I went to Lowe's. I picked up a piece of black foam pipe insulation and that night I made a few crude bugs that look more like pipe insulation with wings than a cicada and headed back to the Elk the very next day.

It worked! I caught more fish that day than at anytime in my brief fly fishing career. I was thrilled! So much so that when David Darnell, former TVFF president and expert fly tyer, asked me how I was doing, I told him I was having a great day and proudly showed him my fly.


I'll never forget his response. "Well, I guess they will eat anything black," and out of pity, gave me one of his. Right then and there I knew I had a lot to learn about matching the hatch. I kept David's fly to use as a pattern for the next time around not realizing that the next time not would occur for 17 years.

All species love cicadas, even carp. Carp are notoriously difficult to catch on a fly. They will seldom even look at a dry fly but will happily gorge themselves on cicadas. Check out the video.

So here it is, 17 years later and Brood 10 will be emerging sometimes between April and June. Fishing will be phenomenal for a week or two and then, the cicadas vanish not to return for another 17 years. So get ready, don't miss out.

Smallmouth Buffalo (Jim Burchette's Report)

Dana,

I was on the Tenn. River below Nickajack dam fishing for white bass, hybrids, stripers - and picked up this guy. I was as surprised as he was, seeing how the water temp was 47 degrees and I wasn't specifically targeting smallmouth buffalo. The rig I was using was an Echo Bad Ass Glass six weight, sinking head fly line (175- 200 gr, I can't remember exactly) and a white / chartreuse Clouser.

Cuz put a bend in that six weight. I usually fish for them with an eight weight and a 300-350 gr sinking head line.

The attached photo is a streamer I use for the buffalo's with good success.


