Materials


Hook: Daiichi 1710 #10-14

Thread: Orange and/or Yellow 6/0-8/0 or 70 Denier

Body: Gold Mylar Tinsel Tag **Ribbing:** Fine Gold Wire

Collar: 4 Strand Rayon Floss, Orange or Yellow

Collar: Rainbow Krystal Flash **Head Cement or similar**



Cost: \$2.00

Another good pattern for bream and bass.

Materials

Hook: Nymph Hook

Thread: Black or olive 140 denier

Body: Green dubbing

Eyes: Bead chain, damsel eyes, small lead eyes

Tail: Maribou

Fish of the Month



May Meeting Recap

Phil Ekema, District 1 Fisheries Supervisor in the Fisheries Division of Alabama DCNR, was the speaker at the May meeting. He gave an interesting talk on bass fishing in North Alabama. He described the fishery and how it is monitored through creel surveys, net surveys and electro-fishing. He had extensive statistics for research on Pickwick Lake with many charts and graphs. There was a "school" of questions from the audience which means he had our attention and our interest. One stat I remember is that on average it takes 100 hours of fishing to catch a 5 lb. largemouth bass.

Donovan Lakes Trips

The club hosted 2 trips 2 Donovan Lakes in Marion AL this year. The first was May 11-17. The second was May 22-26. Weather conditions were very different, the first trip was hot with temps getting to 90 for a couple of the days. The second trip was cooler with morning temps in the 60's and afternoon temps in the low to mid 70's. The fish barely cooperated on the first trip with low catch rates and most fish in the 1 to 2 pound range. There was a morning bite some mornings but almost never an evening bite. 

Early May, angler Scott Enloe landed a massive Lake Trout. The fish was caught in a reservoir somewhere in Gunnison County, Colorado (guess they don't want us to know). Enloe was using a jig set up. In all the fight with this fish took around 15 minutes. This behemoth trout had a girth of 37 inches and weighed over 73 pounds. The current Lake Trout record is just over 50 pounds, so if certified by the state board, this trout should easily break that record. Look at this monster below!




National Cheese Day
