


#### **Our Annual TVFF Banquet**

## **5** Streamers for Trout

Fall is prime time for streamer fishing for trout. I myself prefer using a streamer for trout, more fun and more exciting than nymphing. Below are Fly Lords best streamers for trout. Full article by Nolan Bluntzer can be found <u>here</u>.

#### **Articulated Trout Slider (right)**

Pros: Fished variety of ways, good sculpin imitation, fun to fishCons: Hard to tie, best fished with sinking lines

## Sex Dungeon (below)

**Pros:** Tried and true pattern, versatile, sinks fast **Cons:** Heavy on lighter rods



## Game Changer (below)

**Pros:** Can be fished various retrieves, lifelike, comes in variety of size and colors **Cons:** Can be heavy to cast





#### Sparkle Minnow (below)

Pros: Easy to tie, unique jigging action, great tailwater fly

Cons: Single hook pattern



## Flatliner (below)

**Pros:** Unique side action, fools large trout, fishes near surface **Cons:** Requires sink tip to get down





## Legendary Saltwater Fly Tyer Bob Popovics Passes Away

This morning, the saltwater fly fishing world lost one of its greatest legends. Bob Popovics, the visionary tyer who forever changed our sport with patterns like the Surf Candy and Hollow Fleye, passed away peacefully at 3 a.m. on November 1, 2024. After being hospitalized in late September following a tragic hit-and-run accident in Seaside Heights, NJ, Bob's final days were surrounded by family, friends, and countless prayers from the fishing community.

Bob wasn't just a master tyer; he was an innovator, a mentor, and a friend to anglers everywhere. His work opened doors to what saltwater flies could be—combining artistry, durability, and pure fish-catching effectiveness. For decades, Bob's creations have inspired countless fly tyers to push boundaries, and his legacy will no doubt continue to shape the sport he loved.

To Bob's family, friends, and all those touched by his creativity and kindness, we extend our deepest condolences. Today, the fly fishing community mourns a legend whose impact will be felt in every cast, every tie, and every fish caught with one of his patterns. Rest easy, Bob. You will be missed, but your influence will live on.

Used once to catch and release a beautiful sailfish in the Indian Ocean off of Kenya. I researched all the bluewater big game reels and bought this as the best of the best before my trip. It was and still is state of the art. The best big game reels ever made? Probably the best that ever will be made. These are highly sought after. Not making them any more.

Lever Action twin disc drags with Teflon impregnated graphite/cork drag washers (no lube). Smooth braking and can't lock up. Easy and safe to change drag with lever while fighting fish. Anti Reverse (no busted knuckles). Sealed precision needle bearings. Frame and spool military grade hard anodized marine bar stock aluminum. Other parts are polished stainless steel. The reel seat is titanium. Super tough and dependable reel in every aspect. Came with 30 year unconditional guarantee including corrosion. This was the confidence Hayden had in his reels.

Professionally (and beautifully) rigged with 750 yds of Bionic Braid backing (original cost for the backing alone was \$180) ,saltwater line, leader. This is the finest line rig/setup I have ever seen but given its age I cannot be responsible for the line. Set for left hand retrieve (crank with left hand) but can be easily reversed (original tool and instructions included). Ready to take on the biggest game fish: Tuna, Billfish, Shark, Wahoo, etc. ~4 5/8" dia., 15oz. With original box, soft cover, manual, orig. grease, custom tool. Hate to give it up but time has caught up with me and I will not be able to use it again.






#### Huntsville Orvis Holiday V.I.P. Event

#### **Trout Stocked at Madison County Public Fishing Lake**

**Trout fishing** season at Madison County Public Fishing Lake (PFL) began **Friday, November 29, 2024**. The Division of Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries plans to stock over 3,000 pounds of rainbow trout in Madison County PFL during the trout season with trout ranging in size from one to two pounds. A \$5.00 Daily Trout Permit in addition to a valid freshwater fishing license is required to fish for trout. Trout anglers may also fish for bass, bluegill, catfish, and crappie. The daily creel limit is 4 trout per angler. Check their <u>website</u> for directions and hours of operation, which are limited, so check before you go.

#### **Fly Tester Tank**

Thanks to the generous donation from the Huntsville Orvis store, TVFF now has a "Flymen Fly Tester" tank available to members so that they may test flies and follow the action of the fly under simulated stream conditions. The tank was tested out at the November fly tying meeting and performed perfectly with several different types of flies.



## **Winter Solstice**

**Date When Celebrated :** December 21, 2024

Winter Solstice marks the beginning of winter and is the shortest day of the year.
