April 8, 7 p.m

Adult Damsel Fly - Featured Tyer, Joe Tremblay

Cost: \$2.00 (See Pg. 4 for additional info.)

This fly is a direct result of YouTube's <u>Damsel in Distress Video</u>. I first tied this fly 5+/- years ago and made a few improvements since then. Like most flies I tie, it's a combination of features I liked from other patterns as well as my own ideas. This fly will catch all species and can be tied in a variety of colors to match damsels in your favorite waters.

You will need; a lighter, tweezers, and a black Sharpie.



Materials:

Thread: Black 8/0 Tail: 3/32" foam cylinder, color of choice

Parachute: White Hook: Saber #10 or compatible light caddis hook Wing: Badger hackle Body: Black dry fly dubbing or peacock herl

Eyes: Black mono eyes

April 22, 7 p.m.

Fat Albert - Featured Tyer, Fred Kaufman

Cost: \$2.00 (See Pg. 4 for additional info.)

Often the biggest and baddest bug in the fly box, the Fat Albert might need a row all to itself. The titanic of terrestrial patterns, this fly is truly unsinkable! No mater if your fishing cold or warm water, the Fat Albert looks like a juicy steak to hungry fish, so hold on tight as they eagerly race to take your fly!



Thread: Black 140 denier Hook: Hopper hook, #8 or #6
Wing: White poly yarn Body: Tan and brown 2mm foam

Legs: Black round rubber

Connor said the river was beautiful and there were few people. "It was really great, some of the best water I've fished and there were massive bass everywhere," he said. He used a white streamer, an 8-wt rod, and intermediate sinking line.

The bass looks to be getting ready to bed soon. Congrats on a real nice fish, Everett. It's a great start to the 2021 bass season.



March Speaker David Perry. Thank you David Perry of <u>Southeastern</u> Fly for our March presentation. David is a veteran fishing guide on the Elk River and Caney Fork in southern and middle Tennessee respectively, in addition to other destinations. David said presentation with a good, clean drift and location (near the bottom) using nymphs, white streamers, and wooly buggers, are successful tactics. He predicts good fishing on the Caney and Elk this spring. This year's anticipated cicada hatch, should it develop later this year, could be a bonus especially for carp. David guides half-day, three-quarter, and full-day trips.


The Session of Faith Presbyterian Church reserves the right to alter or rescind this policy and the use of the building if deemed necessary due to increased health and safety risks.

TVFF Guidelines for Fly Tying Sessions at Faith Presbyterian Church in April

Our goal is to resume in-person activities for all events as soon as possible. In the meantime, we will begin the process with the fly-tying sessions because they have fewer people than a club meeting.

The April Club Meeting on April 15th will be by Zoom only.

The first in-person meetings at the church will be for the *April 8th and April 22nd Fly Tying* sessions. The in-person tying sessions will be for those who are fully vaccinated. There will still be a Zoom Meeting for those not yet vaccinated or who prefer to tie from home. We will resume collecting a \$2.00 fee for fly tying kits at kit pickup and from tyers at the church. This fee is to reimburse the lead tyer for the cost of materials. Thank you to those who have donated to the club for tying sessions during the past year but be aware that your donation went to the club and the tying leaders have not been reimbursed.



Venite piscemur. Fly fishing might have been "discovered" by the Roman Claudius Aelianus near the end of the 100s. (*History of Fly Fishing*, by <u>Dub</u> Paetz). "He described the practices of Macedonian anglers: "...they have planned a snare for the fish... They fasten red wool. . . round a hook, and fit on to the wool two feathers which grow under a cock's wattles... color are like wax. Their rod is six feet long, and their line is the same length. Then they throw their snare... the fish, attracted and maddened by the color, comes straight at it, thinking from the pretty sight to gain a dainty mouthful; when, however, it opens its jaws, it is caught by the hook, and enjoys a bitter repast, a captive'." In his book "Fishing from the Earliest Times"; however, William Radcliff (1921) gave the credit to Martial (Marcus Valerius Martialis), born some two hundred years before Aelianus, who wrote: "...Who has not seen the scarus rise, decoyed and killed by fraudful flies..." . Radcliff writes that it was not until the end of the 15th century that fly fishing was practiced as a sport by the upper classes of England, although an exact date is unknown. It may have been around 1496. In any event, it's a wonderful sport and pasttime. So, "come fish."

TVFF member **Ted Crona** wrote about the Red Butt Fuzzy Stuff wet fly last year. Here's his <u>article</u> about the fly and its attributes. Ted says he's been tying the fly ever since he watched a fisherman at Guntersville Lake cast three red-butt wet flies and haul in three bream on a single cast. Ted says he uses silk floss and some "fuzzy stuff" for the fly's body. It works on bream and, Ted assures, other fish as well. Ted's article is on Page 6 of the April 2020 TVFF Club News. Zoom Meeting Instructions: You will receive a Zoom meeting invitation in the TVFF reminder email that is sent on Sunday evening before a scheduled fly-tying night or club meeting. There are three ways to join the meeting. You can copy/paste the link in the invitation into your browser, OR go to https://zoom.us and click "Join A Meeting" in the upper right of the screen, OR if you have installed the Zoom app then you can open the app and enter the meeting number and password from the invitation. If prompted, you should click yes to allow Zoom to use the camera and microphone on your computer, then we can see and hear you during the meeting. You may be placed in a Zoom "waiting room" when you first join. Be patient and you will be admitted to the meeting by a host or cohost. This is another layer of security for our online meetings.

2021 Donavan Lakes Club Trip Update. The

Flyvines is a Montana <u>company</u> that "upcycles" used fly line into bracelets, lanyards, dog collars, sunglass straps ,and other useful items that give used fly line a second life. The picture shows used fly line collected by TVFF in 2019 that didn't end up in a landfill. The pandemic kept us from doing that in 2020 but we'd like to participate again this year. If you respool your fly reels with new line then please coil it up and bring it to us. TVFF will pack it in a box and send it Flyvines. It is a small thing you can do to be kind to the environment and support our conservation efforts.
